### Director of Safety & Training Report

Since the Club began the Member Range Safety Orientation program on January 1, 2020 we have trained over 1230 members along with some of their family guests. The program has been a huge success in promoting firearm safety at the Club. The number of violations has been steadily decreasing.

We conducted a Chief Range Safety Officer class and a general Range Safety Officer class in June , certifying 4 Chief RSOs and 23 new NRA Range Safety Officers. RSO's are ambassadors of the Club promoting good will, fellowship, firearm safety education, and occasional enforcement as needed.

The RSO's report a noticeable decrease in safety violations since the Member Orientation classes began. However, there are a couple of issues that that we still see:

Poor safe gun handling leading to muzzles pointed in unsafe directions. Remember the Firing Line Safety Rules:

ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction. ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot. ALWAYS keep the gun unloaded until ready to use. ALWAYS keep the action open while people are downrange. NEVER handle firearms while people are downrange.

And make sure that everyone stays behind the yellow line on every range while the line is cold and people are downrange. Following this rule is critical, providing an extra layer of protection for all members and guest ensuring that no one downrange will suffer serious injury or death!

#### **New Member Orientation**

New Member Orientation is now only held one time per month the first Tuesday of each month from 5:30 PM until 6:45 PM. Remember that members only have to attend this class once as long as you maintain continuous membership. We still a few existing members that haven't taken the class. Reminder, flip the switch when people are going downrange, and it is a relay switch so whoever turns it on also turns it off.



On April 10th & 11th, GTGC Hosted the Spindletop Silhouette Championship, an NRA Registered Match, with attendees representing five states. The Championship consisted of two 40 shot Small Bore Standard Rifle Matches on Saturday the 10th & two 40 shot Small Bore Hunter Rifle Matches on Sunday the 11th.

Guests arrived on Friday to sight in and practice and had the opportunity to shoot a 60 round Air Rifle Match on the 25-50 Yard Range as a warm-up for the Small Bore matches over the weekend. As a side event, "Gabby" Jones ran an Air Pistol Match during the Small Bore Matches on Saturday and Sunday. This gave several of the shooters an introduction to shooting Air Pistol.

The 4H Youth Group furnished target setters, and GTGC donated to 4H as a fundraiser for their shooting program. Thanks are extended to the parents and youngsters who participated in this event. You all helped make it a success. Thanks to Charlie Shelton for his assistance with logistics, Jesse Marua, Pat Stieger, and Allen Corneau, who helped out with the door prizes, and to the Club RSOs and Staff for hosting this event.

Everyone had a good time and are looking forward to having the match again next year.


# Use the website or download the App to stay connected and show your GATE CARD

#### **CLUB IMPROVEMENTS**

This past year has brought a lot of improvements and much-needed maintenance on the Ranges. We overhauled the LTC Range and improved the Silhouette Range by adding more shooting benches and dirt work. The 25/50, Action, Rifle, and 600-yard Ranges all have berm and dirt work. We also put in a new main entrance road, launched an RSO program, took our membership through an Orientation class, created a new website, added an online payment system and notification system via the website, email system, and the new App, found creative ways to battle the cost of lumber for our target stands, overhauled our SOP and Bylaws to make them more relevant for the system we have today, and the list keeps going. Improvements are still on the horizon and need to continue.

#### What is coming next?

Internal Road repairs, installing internet, raising the berms on the Silhouette Range, more dirt work on the Action Range, lane markers on the Rifle Range, new overhead metal installed on the 25/50 Range, electrical service added to the 600-yard Range as well as more dirt work, a painting maintenance plan across the Club, the addition of new pistol bays to the south of the Activities Building and additional AC in the Activities Building.

We have evaluated our Club with the improvements mentioned and made a vast comparison to your Club vs. others and found that we had greater facilities at a much lower price point. With all of the maintenance of the Club and the needed improvements, the Board unanimously elected to raise the dues on a three-year rolling plan.

Raising the Dues on a Three Year Roll Out

Phase one affects New Members only (9/1/21); Phase two affects Individual Members (9/1/22); and Phase Three affects Discounted Members (9/1/23).

Year 1 New Members	Stage One: Begins on September 1, 2021 New Members Increase: Initiation Fee \$125 Individual \$150 Senior, Junior, LEO/Military \$100 Spouse: \$75 Existing Membership Dues stay the same.
Year 2 Full Pay Members	<b>Stage Two: Begins Renewal 2022</b> New Membership: Same as Stage One <b>Individual Increases to: \$150</b> Senior, Junior, LEO/Military: Remains \$75 Spouse: Remains \$50
Year 3 Discounted Members	Stage Three: Begins Renewal 2023 New Membership: Same as Stage One Individual: \$150 Senior, Junior, LEO/Military: Increases to \$100 Spouse: Increases to \$75
